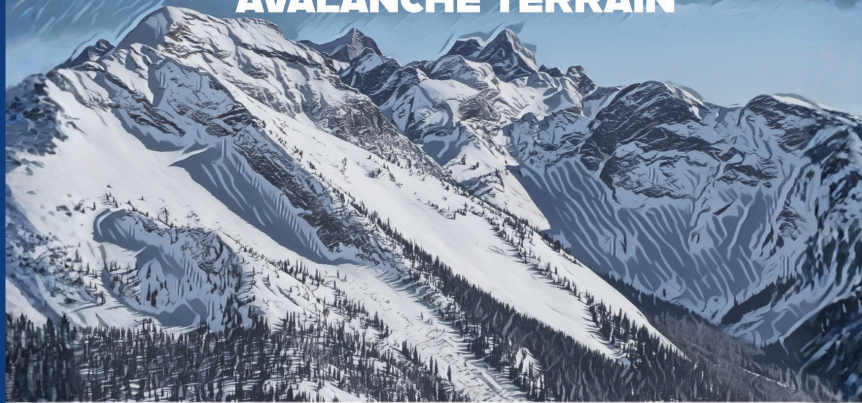

Did you know?

Voting rights are granted to citizens based on residency or property ownership. There is no corporate or business vote in local elections.

Resident electors

In order to be eligible to vote in general local elections or by-elections as a resident, a person must:

- Be 18 years of age or older when they register to vote, or 18 years or older on general voting day
- Be a Canadian citizen
- Have been a resident of B. C. for at least six months immediately before they register to vote
- Be a resident of the municipality or electoral area on the day they register to vote; and
- Not be disqualified under the Local Government Act, or any other enactment from voting in local elections or be otherwise disqualified by law

ADVANCED PUBLIC NOTICE

Pursuant to Section 66 of the Transportation Act, and to provisions of the Commercial Transport Act, notice is hereby given that load restrictions may be placed on short notice in the near future on all roads within the Village of McBride Municipal boundaries.

The restrictions will limit vehicles to 100 percent, 70 percent, or 50 percent of legal axle loading. Trucking and transportation companies, as well as the general public, should govern themselves accordingly.

If you require a Load Restriction Exemption, please contact the Village office at 250-569-2229. Please note that emergency & delivery vehicles are exempt from the 50% weight restrictions. Your cooperation in adhering to the above regulations is appreciated.
